## Research Interests

Acculturation & Multicultural Identities/Experiences: Psycho-social, personality, and cognitive processes; Individual differences in multi/bicultural identity; Social–network approaches to acculturation and cultural identity; Psychological outcomes of biculturalism (social, cognitive, and adjustment-related).

Culture and Social-Personality Processes: Identification and measurement of culture-specific and -general personality constructs; Interplay of cultural values and personality in predicting wellbeing; Bilingualism and personality self-schemas.

Cross-Cultural Research Methods: Cultural/linguistic issues in instrument development and adaptation, and in psychological assessment; Combined emic-etic methodology.
