#### Short biography

In my graduate education at the University of Vienna, I was trained in theoretical linguistics with an emphasis on syntactic theory as well as interface-issues (syntax-morphology, syntax-semantics, and syntax-pragmatics). At this time my primary language focus was on Germanic. After completing my graduate work I came to the University of British Columbia in 1996 as a postdoctoral researcher and later as a faculty member. Here I expanded my language specialization to include Upriver Halkomelem (Salish), Blackfoot (Algonquian) and Ktunaxa (aka Kutenai). I have published extensively on typological issues viewed from the angle of theoretical linguistics, which I more recently expanded to include the language of interactional language. My relocation to ICREA and UPF coincides with the start of a new research agenda: the cognitive underpinnings of grammatical knowledge including how language is used in interaction, embodied language, language acquisition, languag in neuro-diverse profiles, and human-machine interaction.

#### **TEACHING**

#### (a) Areas of special interest and accomplishments

My area of interest in teaching complements my area of research: syntax and its interfaces as well as field-work. This is reflected in the courses that I typically teach. In particular, I have been teaching introductory syntax and morphology courses both at the graduate level (LING 520) and at the undergraduate level (LING 300, LING 201, LING 305). Moreover, I have taught field-methods three times: once on Blackfoot and twice on Ktunaxa. All courses have inspired students to continue working on the language and several qualifying papers and dissertations are a direct result of these courses. Furthermore, I have taught and co-taught several advanced (pro-) seminars on specific topics related to my research (LING 447, LING 530).

Between 2011 and 2015 I have taken on the large undergraduate introductory course LING 100 with typically around 250 students enrolled. This is a challenging course, given the large number of students. While the course has been successful, judging from the student evaluations, I have redesigned the course to follow the "flipped classroom model". By now I have produced 14 animated videos covering the content of the lectures. In addition, students produce similar materials for their final projects. All of these videos are showcased on a dedicated website which was used in the course (<a href="http://ling100videos.arts.ubc.ca/">http://ling100videos.arts.ubc.ca/</a>). This initiative was in response to a need for a change in teaching methods, given the changing student population as well as the change in the kind of information that is available to students and was extended to include other courses (e.g., LING 300).

In my current position at UPF I have a much reduced teaching load at 1 course a year. I alternate between teaching comparative linguistics and Semantics and pragmatics. For the latter course I have created teaching videos that facilitate learning outside the classroom (<a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=dvpZwKOj5rQ">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=dvpZwKOj5rQ</a>)

#### SCHOLARLY AND PROFESSIONAL ACTIVITIES

#### (a) Areas of special interest and accomplishments

My research explores the fundamental building blocks of human language, and how languages differ in their realization. I pursue this research focusing on several empirical domains: traditional grammatical categories, categories belonging to interactional language, language in the context of self-talk, language in the context of human-machine interaction, as well as the linguistic profiles in non-typical adult populations, including children as well as neuro-diverse populations. I do this by using the framework I developed in my two monographs (Wiltschko 2014, 2021) the Universal Spine Hypothesis according to which the grammar of all languages are constrained by a set of hierarchically organized universal functions (the spine) and the Interactional Spine Hypothesis according to which interactional language too is regulated by the

an extension of the universal spine. Thus, my research links to neighboring fields, including philosophy (referential semantics, pragmatics), sociology (conversation analysis), and psychology (theory of mind).
